As for allergens, Ragweed is second only to mold in causing allergic symptoms. There are 17 species of Ragweed in North America. The common ragweed (*Ambrosia artemisiifolia*) can produce a million grains of pollen per plant daily, the Giant Ragweed (*Ambrosia trifida*) can create in excess of 1.25 million grains daily and over a billion during its life cycle.
