The bald eagle (*Haliaeetus leucocephalus*) was classified by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in 1978 as endangered in 43 states (including Arizona) and threatened in five others. It was not listed as endangered or threatened in Alaska and does not occur in Hawaii. In 1995, the species was downlisted to threatened in all recovery regions of the lower 48 states.
