Immanuel Kant (1724–1804) is the central figure in modern philosophy. He synthesized early modern rationalism and empiricism, set the terms for much of nineteenth and twentieth century philosophy, and continues to exercise a significant influence today in metaphysics, epistemology, ethics, political philosophy, aesthetics, and other fields.

The Critique of Pure Reason (Kritik der reinen Vernunft) is a 1781 book by the German philosopher Immanuel Kant, in which the author seeks to determine the limits and scope of metaphysics. A heavily-revised second edition was published in 1787. Also referred to as Kant's "First Critique", it was followed by the Critique of Practical Reason (1788) and the Critique of Judgment (1790).

Arnold Keyserling was the first modern philosopher to discover the basic constitutional Laws by which we can attain mastery and true individuality. As he sometimes puts it, these are the criteria by which we can attain "coherence in a chaotic world". In philosophic terms, he searched for and eventually found the "a priori synthesis" or long-lost "philosopher's stone".
